# **Cyber Safety Tips**

- The Internet is a **public place**! Assume that all messages you send can be read by everyone.
- Do not post anything online you do not want the whole world to see and have access to forever.
- Do not give out your ASL (age, sex, location) or any other personal information online.



- Keep your webpage private and do not share your password with anyone except your parents.
- "Stop, Block, And Tell!" If someone says or sends you something that makes you uncomfortable, sign off, block them, and report the incident.
- **NEVER** meet anyone in the real world that you met online.
- Avoid chat rooms and **NEVER** go private with someone you met in a chat room.
- Keep your webcam unplugged when you're not using it. NEVER use a webcam with someone you don't know.

### What is Cyber-Bullying?

• Using cell-phones, the internet, chat rooms or e-mail to hurt or scare someone i.e. - mean e-mails or texts, posting or distributing pictures and spreading lies or rumours.

### How to Avoid Cyber-Bullying:

- Speak up against bullying when you see it.
- Never make threats or mean comments over the Internet, even as a joke.
- If you are bullied online, talk to a trusted adult. Telling is not tattling!
- Print out any threats you receive or see and show them to a trusted adult. The incident may be subject to school and or police investigation.
